The teachers are recruited on the basis of the recommendation of the West Bengal College Service Commission while staff members are recruited by the college authority strictly following the guidelines of the Government of West Bengal. However, the college authority on its own discretion appoints Guest Faculties and Ad-hoc Non-teaching staffs.

### 6.3.8 Industry Interaction / Collaboration

A few departments like Commerce, Physics etc. have been keeping contact with its associated industry and try to give exposures to their students for further development, practical knowledge and campus placement. The college manage to receive fund under “Gnandhara” scheme initiated by P. C. Chandra Group of companies as a part of their CSR activities for development of Knowledge Centre.

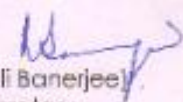
